### \*NOTES\*

- \*1 In addition to the grebe total were 4 broods of grebelings numbering 4, 3, 3 and 2. One being fed a small fish.
- \*2 Both bitterns were observed as they flushed S. from W. side of main dike road.
- \*3 In addition to the goose total were 2 broods of goslings numbering 3 and 3.
- \*4 In addition to the Gadwall total were 4 broods of ducklings numbering 15, 8, 8 and 3.
- \*5 In addition to the Mallard total were 2 broods of ducklings numbering 8 and 5.
- \*6 In addition to the Wood Duck total was a brood of 4 ducklings.
- \*7 One flying over the site to E. cell tower nest, then later one breaking off a snag limb and taking to same nest.
- \*8 Four eyasses were seen on the nest with both adults nearby.
- \*9 Both adults in NW. quadrant, but nesting still unconfirmed and one SW. adult on territory, then prey to nest.
- \*10 In addition to the coot total were 3 broods of cootlings numbering 5, 2 and 2.
- \*11 Willow Flycatchers were seen heard singing by both census teams.
- \*12 Nesting Bushtits were observed with young on a nest in the trees next to the hotel and not directly on site.
- \*13 The chat was only heard by the pond team from the main dike road in the same area as was seen last month.

### MORE NOTES

No owls were seen at the S. Russell Road nest box. No owls were seen at Anderson Park.
