MORE NOTES

A food begging juvenile in NE forest was also seen soaring with adults. One food begging juvenile heard in SW quad. Water levels were back to normal for this time of year and much lower than was observed on last month's census. Mammals observed were one coyote, disappearing into the NE. forest and at least three Eastern Cottontails.
