### \*NOTES\*

- \*1 One adult atop the power tower south of the south viewing tower and a second adult atop the next tower east.
- \*2 One SW. adult on SW. tower. One NW. adult was heard in the NW. forest, then was seen flying to the north.
- \*3 Brown harrier was hunting low over the main part of the lagoon, flying east to west toward the wet meadows.
- \*4 Three snipe were heard from the south viewing tower prior to the start of the census, but were included.
- \*5 Two owls hunting in the SW. quadrant over S. paved trail prior to the start of the census, but were included.
- \*6 One seen early near the NW. amphibian pond, then flew across the river and another heard near the E. knoll.
- \*7 Prior to the start of the census approximately 450 crows exited from the north end of the site, flying to the SW.

### MORE NOTES

A single Snow Goose was observed flying overhead to the South by the ponds team, but too high to count.  
No sign of owls in the Anderson Park Pines.
