### \*NOTES\*

- \*1 The herons that were seen were leaving and arriving at the nests, which are now well camouflaged with foliage.
- \*2 One heron seen along the NE. ditch, just inside the NE. gate and the other was seen from the end of main dike.
- \*3 One Osprey was observed flying too high overhead to include in the census. Our Osprey pole has fallen by wind.
- \*4 The NE. resident dark morph male was seen flying from S. to NW. forest and one SW. adult was atop tower one.
- \*5 In addition to one rail heard by the pond team, there were two rails heard in the wetland at E. end of bike path.
- \*6 One Barn Owl was briefly observed in the nest box before it disappeared behind an interior wall inside the box.
- \*7 The warblers that were identified were 9 myrtles, 55 Audubon's and the rest were undetermined, as to their race.
- \*8 A flock of 35 cross-bills flying near Anderson Park, 12 near the nursery, 3 by the bike path and 6 near the ponds.
