- \*2 The eagle..... SEEN WHERE, by the ponds team.....WHAT BEHAVIOR?
- \*3 The brown harrier was seen by both the meadows team and the pond team, WHERE, WHAT BEHAVIOR?
- \*4 One ADULT? JUVENILE? PERCHED? FLYING? WHEN? WHERE? was seen by the meadows team.
- \*5 Two SY juveniles were seen by the meadows team PERCHED? FLYING? WHERE? and one un-aged seen by ponds. NOTE: My field trippers scoped a male adult Cooper's Hawk in a small deciduous tree near the north fence of the middle parking lot at 11am. Would this be additional COHA?
- \*6 The NE. resident dark morph male was seen along with several un-aged likely migrants observed by both teams.
- \*7 One female kestrel perched? Note: MY FIELD TRIPPERS SCOPED TWO IN SEPARATE SNAGS AT 11am.
- \*8 The warblers that were identified were 5 myrtles, 1 Audubon's and the rest were undetermined, as to race.
- \*9 WE NEED A NOTE FOR THE LOCATION OF THE RAILS AND MAYBE ONE FOR KILLDEER. ANY MORE???
